

#### Potential impacts of COVID-19 in destinations

Jobs accommodation and food services make 20% of all vulnerable positions. They are subject to furlough, layoffs.



#### Protected area closures

Parks and outdoor spaces: How did the number of visitors change since the beginning of the pandemic?, Apr 4, 2020



Change in visitor numbers is measured relative to a baseline day; a baseline day is the median value from the 5-week period between Jan 3rd and Feb 6th 2020. This index is smoothed to the rolling 7-day average.



#### Protected area closures

"Virunga National Park closed the park due to possible effect that COVID-19 would have on the mountain gorillas, being an endangered species, we had to put their welfare as a priority above everything, so therefore we have had 100% cancellations and have taken no bookings. Therefore the financial effect of COVID-19 has been devastating on cash flow for the park".









## Changes in local employment due to COVID-19

- 543 African operators reporting staff numbers in the last completed financial year collectively employed 48 041 people (with an average of 88 staff each).
- The majority are **local people** (59 % are recruited from within 50 km), followed by nationals (33 %) and expatriates (8 %).














#### 2018 – 9th consecutive year of sustained growth
