### **ABOUT ICRTH**


The International Conference on Responsible Tourism and Hospitality (ICRTH) was first planned by the Sarawak Research Society (SRS) in 2019 under the Centre for Responsible Borneo (REBORN) mission with the aim to advance the discourse on responsible tourism for sustainable development. It is purposefully designed as an avenue to facilitate networking and harness partnership.

But due to the COVID-19 outbreak in March 2020 and the uncertainty it created, the initial plan for ICRTH2020 in August 2020 was postponed. With the support of the Ministry of Tourism, Creative Industry and Performing Arts (MTCP) Sarawak, ICRTH2021 was held on 27-28 May 2021. Aligning with the issues pertaining to COVID-19 and the resolve of tourism stakeholders to recover and rebuild tourism industry, ICRTH adopted the theme "Rebuilding Tourism for the Future through Sustainable Development" to commence its maiden edition in 2021.

ICRTH is a professional conference that brings different minds together, including governments, practitioners, academicians, researchers, and local community. Even though it is a new conference, it has received significant attention from the local and global communities.



#### **BACKGROUND**

Aligning with the call to rebuilding tourism industry in the post-COVID-19 era, ICRTH2021 employed the theme "Rebuilding Tourism for the Future through Sustainable Development" to kickstart academic and professional discourse about responsible tourism.

The virtual conference was formally opened by the Deputy Minister of Tourism in Sarawak and the Director of the World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO) in Asia Pacific. It included 3 keynote speeches, 1 expert dialogue, 13 professional forums, and 8 professional workshops with 100 speakers from 28 countries. It was participated by more than 3,500 delegates across 96 countries. The event was also joined by representatives from Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA) and United Nations University, who shared their views about tourism recovery. The conference ended with a closing ceremony, chaired by the Minister of Tourism, Creative Industry and Performing Arts (MTCP) Sarawak, where the declaration of Sarawak Commitment to Responsible Tourism was made on May 28. The Minister was accompanied by the Ministry's Permanent Secretary and the Conference Chair.





#### **BACKGROUND**

ICRTH2022, held physically at UCSI Hotel Kuching on 1-3 September, was an event co-organised by Sarawak Research Society and Faculty of Hospitality and Tourism Management, UCSI University with the support of the Ministry of Tourism, Creative Industry and Performing Arts Sarawak, Emerald Publishing as well as other local and international bodies. It was a continuation of the milestone success of ICRTH2021.

Focusing on responsible tourism, ICRTH2022 adopted the theme "Mobilising Responsible Tourism into Actions: Towards Economic Prosperity, Socio-Cultural Inclusivity and Environmental Sustainability". Though the event took place in Kuching, Sarawak, and it was organised using a hybrid mode.





# RESPONSIBLE TOURISM FIELDWORK



To put responsible actions into practice, the post-conference Responsible Tourism fieldwork was arranged to after ICRTH (3 - 4 September 2022). The fieldwork is a collaboration with Southeast Asia Research Academy (SEARA), and it provided a good avenue for delegates to turn words into actions and build connections not only among the delegates, but also with the local community. They spent two days in a suburb in Sarawak called Bau, a destination which is renowned for its gold mining activities since 19th century.

One of the places they visited was Tasik Biru, a stunning blue lake located about an hour's drive from the city center. Tasik Biru was a gold mine and is surrounded by lush greenery and limestone hills. The lake gets its name from its bright blue color, which is caused by the high mineral content of the water. The SEARA members and several ICRTH delegates were mesmerized by the natural beauty of Tasik Biru and spent a few hours exploring the area. They took plenty of photographs and enjoyed the peaceful surroundings. It was a perfect escape from the hustle and bustle of the city and a great way to connect with nature.







# RESPONSIBLE TOURISM FIELDWORK

The next day, the delegates were mesmerized by Paku Rock Maze Garden – a precious karst landform that offers a unique and enchanting attraction with its winding paths (maze) made of rocks. Our next destination was 'Sleeping Beauty', an outline of a mountain resembling the head, chest, and body of a woman sleeping from afar. Third, they went to Maw San Historical Lane where they discovered the historic story of 'old Bau' shared by Pemanca Bong. The visit ended at New Buddhist Village, the final destination of the fieldwork.

They then visited Fairy Cave - an impressive nature reserve, a limestone cave. It is named after the stalagmites inside the cave, which are said to resemble fairy creatures. The cave is a popular tourist destination so SEARA members are lucky Fairy Cave was in the itinerary. They headed for Eco-Serembu Park next just in time for the welcoming dinner hosted by the local Bau District authorities. The dinner was accompanied by the performance of Sarawak 'sape' living legend, Matthew Ngau Jau.

Other places they visited includes Eco-Merembu Park, Siniawan Night Market.





# **BACKGROUND**

# TREE PLANTING & ADOPTION










