About Bau District and Its Tourism Development

Sarawak is home to many of Malaysia's natural wonders, among which is Bau District. Located a 40-minute drive away from Sarawak's capital, Bau earned its name when the gold mining industry emerged and flourished in the region during the mid-19th century. Chinese labourers were brought in to work in the mines, but conflicts arose and led to a protest against the White Rajah in 1857. The confrontation forced the protesters to retreat into a cave, where they were either burnt alive or suffocated to death by fire. The cave was henceforth called the Ghost Cave, while the surrounding area came to be known as "Bau", which translates into "smelly" in English. Another story behind Bau's name is related to the Bidayuh people, who referred to the "New Village" as "Kupua Baauh" in their native language. Gradually, "Baauh" became "Bau" for non-Biyaduh speakers.

Bau District may be small but has plenty to offer in terms of attractions, especially when it is managed well and developed responsibly. For example, the Fairy Cave, named after the stalagmite structure at its entrance, recently reopened after undergoing maintenance and upgrading works. Tasik Biru (meaning "blue lake" in English), so-called for its greenish-blue hue produced by the reflections of the plants and sky, was a popular gold mining spot in the early 20th century. Today, it has become a new tourist attraction due to rapid development by a private company as well as various local events and activities. Another example is the Siniawan night market, which was once a station leading to gold mines and a stagnant market up to a decade ago. It is now a must-visit place for food, culture, and art lovers. The recent Siniawan Country Music Festival is also a success story showcasing the district's tourism potential.

At the end of 2020, Sarawak Premier, YB Tan Sri Datuk Patinggi Abang Haji Abdul Rahman Zohari bin Tun Abang Haji Openg, announced a 10-year masterplan to revive and develop a "Greater Bau" in collaboration with the public and private sectors in Sarawak. He asserts that comprehensive economic activities in tourism and agriculture constitute the core of the masterplan for transforming Bau District. "With all this planning, the people of Bau as well as in the whole of Sarawak have a bright future because now, we also control our oil and gas activities," he stated during the launch of the Bau Bicentennial Celebration 2020 at Tasik Biru With an allocation of RM 94 million for basic infrastructure development and RM233 million for the whole masterplan, the Sarawak Premier hopes that tourism will be the new gold for Bau District to exploit. Sharing the same view, Tasik Biru State Assemblyman YB Dato Henry Harry Jinep added, "We want Bau to be the epicentre of Sarawak's eco-tourism industry, capitalising on the tourism belt of Santubong–Bau–Sematan, presenting the endless potential to be developed as the Eco-Tourism capital of Sarawak, leveraging on digital technology [sic]." YB Dato Sri Abdul Karim Rahman Hamzah, the Minister for Tourism, Creative Industry and Performing Arts Sarawak also expressed this sentiment during the grand opening of the Paku Rock Maze Garden and Borneo Keranji Farm on 2 September, where he elevated tourism as the real gold in Sarawak for its great potential to generate wealth for every stakeholder, including the local community, when all parties work together in partnership.

About REBORN and Its Green and Gold Tourism Project

Responsible Borneo (REBORN) is an initiative under the Sarawak Research Society (SRS) aiming to deploy tourism as a vehicle to advance the knowledge and practice of responsible actions for sustainable development. It officially commenced on 28 May 2021 during the closing ceremony of ICRTH2021, when YB Dato Sri Haji Abdul Karim Rahman Hamzah declared the Sarawak Commitment to Responsible Tourism (SACREST) to rebuild tourism responsibly for a sustainable future. One of its pioneering projects is the "Green and Gold Experiential Tourism in Bau District," which focuses on tourism development through effective partnerships with local communities and relevant stakeholders.

One of the initiative's driving beliefs is that tourism stakeholders, including government officials, tourism and hospitality professionals, travel businesses, academics, researchers, associations, students, community members, and visitors, should work in unison to develop tourism purposefully with the local community as the core. In fact, tourism should be developed sustainably not only to minimise its negative impacts but also to maximise benefits for society. In the wake of Covid-19, in particular, the restart and rebound of tourism must be done responsibly to ensure that every stakeholder plays their part effectively as equal partners. This includes involving local community members in tourism projects and activities so that they become resilient to challenges and more capable of safeguarding their destinations and improving their livelihood. Such an approach corresponds to the Post Covid-19 Development Strategy (PCDS) 2030, which lays down the roadmap for Sarawak to grow into a thriving society and developed state by 2030.

This book, Green and Gold Tourism in Bau, serves as a guide to the history, culture, nature, arts, food, and attractions of Bau District. Through vivid descriptions, captivating photographs, and informative anecdotes of the various aspects of life in Bau, readers will be taken on a journey through its tourism destinations and offerings, from the imposing Mount Singai to the mystical Fairy Cave, and from the bustling weekend market to the quiet countryside. This is by no means a comprehensive narrative; rather, it is hopefully a starting point for more content to be created in the future to showcase Bau District and other destinations in Sarawak as well as to demonstrate how we can develop tourism in a responsible manner.


ABOUT BAU DISTRICT

Bau District is not just a place to visit, but a place to explore and experience. This district is rich with "green and gold" where "green" represents nature and landscapes in the District, and "gold" refers to history and culture, using the gold mining history in the area in the 18th-19th century as the reference. Bau is blessed with natural wonders and cultural heritage. It has a long history involving the locals and those who moved to or worked in the area. It is a destination where people can experience culture, adventure, nature, food and festivals (CANFF) which are promoted by Sarawak Tourism Board (STB) and tourism stakeholders in Sarawak to discover more about the state. As the District is just next to Kuching District and is thus not far from Kuching International Airport and Kuching Sentral Bus Terminal, it is convenient for domestic and international visitors to have a day tour and vacation (or staycation) there. Bau Masterplan and Blueprint 2030 with tourism being one of the core sectors demonstrates the long-term strategy and action plans to transform Bau District into Greater Bau, hence another thriving district in Sarawak and Malaysia.

Given its diverse offerings, Bau District has emerged as a popular tourism destination. The local authorities, such as Bau District Office, and local communities have also put a lot of effort into developing various tourism products and destinations. When Movement Control Order (MCO) was lifted, with domestic tourism being a feasible option and intensely promoted in Sarawak, Bau District often appeared to be the primary choice of visitors during weekends and public holidays. Hence, it gives rise to experiential tourism to connect to the nature and culture of Bau rather than mere short visits for leisure. It provides opportunities for visitors to experience and appreciate Bau like never before.



Bau Tourism Information Kiosk is located in Bau town and was constructed as well as officially established in the year 2022. The kiosk operates from **Thursday to Sunday (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.)**. During the launching of the kiosk, the Minister for Tourism, Creative Industry and Performing Arts Sarawak, YB Dato Sri Haji Abdul Karim Rahman Hamzah, mentioned that this was included in the blueprint of Greater Bau 2030. This kiosk will help to promote the tourism products of the locals and provide information for the visitors.

Bung Jagoi Tourism



Bung Jagoi or Mount Jagoi was the first Bidayuh village within the Jagoi areas dating back to the 1920s. It is located on a pristine hilltop with the highest peak measuring 1,600 feet above sea level. Though this legendary Bung Jagoi provided settlement to the community, a place to hunt, collect forest products and practise shifting agriculture, it still has more than 400 hectares of tropical green rainforest. Located an hour's drive from Kuching, Bung Jagoi is situated near the Malaysia-Kalimantan, Indonesia border. Bung means summit in the Bidayuh Bau dialect. Hence the area is near the hilltop, about 280 meters above sea level and surrounded by more than 500 hectares of pristine forest.




With just around 320 meters above sea level, the Bung Jagoi is one of the most family-friendly trails in Kuching. The trail is easy to hike and suitable for children and seniors, perfect for a weekend gateway. Furthermore, it also has a picturesque viewpoint on the summit peak. And if hiking is not your cup of tea, you can bring your family to the waterfall, just a few minutes of walk at the mountain base.



The formation of Malaysia on 16 September 1963 led to the Malaysia-Indonesia confrontation as a result of the policy practised by Indonesia against the Dutch and the Sultanate of Brunei since 1962. From 20 January 1963 to 11 August 1966, Camp Podad was a military operation control base in Sarawak (Malaysia) and Borneo that controlled the border and air route from Lundu to Serian. Also, this area used to become a station which to boost the signal more stronger to other station. Therefore, Podad Camp is a historic place that needs to be visited.

Bung Podad is a peak of mountain located in the Kampung Peros area of the Bau district in the state of Sarawak, Malaysia. It is situated in a hilly area surrounded by lush green forests and is known for its beautiful natural scenery. Like many other villages in the Bau district, Bung Podad is mainly inhabited by the Bidayuh people, who are the indigenous people of Sarawak. The Bidayuh people have a rich cultural heritage and are known for their traditional practices, music, and cuisine. One of the popular dishes of the Bidayuh people is manok pansoh, which is chicken cooked in bamboo over an open fire. Another popular dish is midin, a wild fern cooked with garlic, chilli, and shrimp paste.

Bung Podad is a great place to visit if you are looking to experience the culture and traditions of the Bidayuh people and enjoy the natural beauty of Sarawak. The village offers a peaceful and serene environment, and visitors can enjoy activities like hiking, birdwatching, and swimming in nearby rivers and streams.

BUNG BRATAK HERITAGE CENTRE



Bung Bratak Heritage Centre is one of the most historic heritage sites in Sarawak. The journey from Kuching to Lundu via Batu Kawa/Pekan Bau takes approximately one hour. The entrance fee is RM10 per person. If you want to get in touch with nature, you can spend the night here. The accommodation price ranges from RM90 to RM140, depending on the package provided. The highest peak recorded for Bung Bratak was 161 mdpl. To get to the top, you can continue to hike from behind the cafe around the area. To get here, you may park your vehicle at the foot of the hill and climb leisurely through the steps for 20 to 30 minutes. The comfortable air and the view overlooking Mount Singai and Serapi are very pleasing to the eye and can relieve the fatigue of climbing.





Bung Bratak is one of the settlements of the Jagoi Bidayuh community since 750 years ago. In 1838, it was attacked by outsiders where houses were burned, adults were killed and children were kidnapped. At the time of the incident, Commander Kulow and the others were managing rice crops at the foot of the hill.



Following the incident, Commander Kulow sought the help of Rajah James Brooke and managed to rescue the kidnapped children. After that, Bung Bratak was rebuilt and returned to prosperity and harmony. But over time, the people around this area have moved to other places. Now it is one of the tourist centres in Sarawak, and the Bung Bratak Festival is held on Sept 1 every year to commemorate this event.

One of Sarawak's most famous historical sites is located around the riverine bazaar of Siniawan and Mount Serembu. Siniawan was made famous by Rajah James Brooke who built a cottage high up in the hills. James Brooke first



travelled up the Sarawak River in 1839 to quell a rebellion led by the Sarawak Malay aristocracy under their chief Datu Patinggi Ali who challenged the authority of the Brunei Sultanate who colonised the State from as early as the 15th century. In 1841 after making peace with the Sarawak Malays, Brooke became their Rajah and their Bidayuh allies at Bung Muan and planned to develop the area. After Brooke became Rajah, he put an end to head-hunting and built a cottage just above Bung Muan at a place called Peninjau. Spenser St John said Peninjau got its name from a large rock jutting out of the mountain from where the Rajah would sit and enjoy a panoramic view of Gunung Santubong and the meandering Sarawak River.


DAYAK TUA PEK KONG TEMPLE

Even though the climb may be challenging for someone, But, since Sarawak Forest Corporate (SFC) involved, the facilities is more improved to ensure the safety of visitors. Visitors can access the interior areas, where additional caverns are visible, using adequate concrete walkways. The morning is the ideal time to travel as the sunlight makes the interior structures appear even more amazing to the camera. The large roof hole of Fairy Cave, a colossal breach through which the sun shines into the cave's interior structures, must be the most impressive scenic view of the cave. With its lush vegetation, shimmering sunrays, and intimidating rock environs, the gap itself is a photographer's dream scene.

For those who enjoy taking photos within natural caverns, Fairy Cave in Bau is a must-visit location. Kuching is only a short drive away. You must go up around four flights of steps to get to the door, so be advised! It goes without saying that the view from the summit is stunning. Over the horizon is a cave surrounded by agricultural land with rice fields, other crops, and undeveloped woodland. Another wonder is the cave itself. Stalactites and stalagmites in the limestone caverns with deep scars are massive. The structure of the cave has been described in several literary works as a massive, miles-long limestone protrusion.





GHOST CAVE

The history of Ghost Cave all began when the reform-minded administration under Hadfields Brooke angered the Mau San miners and the Twelve Kongsi, sparking a rebellion against the White Rajah in 1857, led by Liu Shan Bang, the leader of the Twelve Kongsi, at Tian Tsze Lung Kung in Mau San. About 600 miners who had neither proper weapons nor military training, paddled down the Sarawak River to attack the Astana. Hadfields Brooke escaped by swimming across the Sarawak River to the southern shore. Not long after, Brooke retaliated with his army, comprising Skrang Iban warriors and Malays loyal to him, and defeated the miners in a series of counterattacks. More than 100 miners were killed, including Liu Shan Bang in Jugan Siniawan. The Shan Teck

Temple in Siniawan was later built in memory of the tragic event. It was said that the remaining miners retreated further into Mau San. Some escaped to Sambas and Kalimantan, while most perished on the way. Many miners and their families hid in Ghost Cave and were subsequently hunted down and killed by the Rajah's forces. The Rajah's forces blocked the cave's entrance by wooden blocks and burned it. The victims inside the cave were chocked by the smoke and died. Since then, many Bau residents have been avoiding the cave like a plague after being told it was haunted.

The mining cave is situated within a Totally Protected Area (TPA) of the Dered Krian National Park, managed by the Sarawak Forestry Corporation (SFC). This low-lying area is susceptible to flooding, especially during the rainy season. However, during a recent tour, it was alarming to discover an increase in illegal mining activities within the cave, causing significant damage to its interior. Unless these unlawful mining activities are halted, they pose a severe threat to permanently altering the cave's natural state. To address this issue, Sarawak Delta GeoPark collected samples for further investigation.

The Mau San Tian Tsze Lung Kung is more than a century old. It was founded around the time when gold and antimony were discovered in Mau San around the 1820s to 1830s. The host deity is Lau Chu Tian Tsze, a deity of Hakka origin since most miners were Hakka. Most of them originated from Sambas, Kalimantan. This temple provided the pioneer miners with spiritual support and served as a centre for cultural activities and other administrative matters of the Twelve Kongsi. Before the arrival of Sir James Brooke, Sarawak was under the rule of Brunei. Around that time, Sarawak, particularly the settlement around the gold mining areas, was facing an uprising against the Brunei ruling from native Dayaks and Malays. James Brooke assisted the Sultan of Brunei to settle the local civil war and thus was granted White Rajah to rule Sarawak. As Brooke established his rule over Sarawak, he began to impose taxes, prohibit opium and wine trading, and restrict gold and antimony trading, particularly to the self-governing Mau San and the Twelve Kongsi. It was said that James Brooke had previously established an agreement with the Twelve Kongsi regarding non-intervention in respective areas, partly because of his involvement with the local civil war between Brunei and local Dayaks and earlier political circumstances. The Twelve Kongsi and the Chinese miners in Mau San were already well established. They were contented with their self-ruling since the poor administration by Brunei and the civil war.

The reforming Brooke administration provoked the Mau San miners and the Twelve Kongsi. Thus, a rebellion started against the White Rajah. The rebellion was initiated in 1857 at Tian Tsze Lung Kung in Mau San by Liu Shan Bang, the leader of the Twelve Kongsi. 600 armed miners, without proper weapons and military training, paddled down the Sarawak River and attacked the Astana. James Brooke escaped the assault. Five Europeans were killed, and one was mistaken to be James Brooke. With no political will and planning, the Chinese miners stayed and ruled Kuching for three days before returning to their base. More than a hundred miners were killed, including the leader Liu Shan Bang. The Shan Teck Temple in Siniawan was later constructed in memory of the tragic event of Liu Shan Bang and his associates.

Siniawan town has a different meaning to most people in Kuching. It is famously known as the "Siniawan Night Market". Back in the days, Siniawan would cater to the gold prospectors in nearby Bau, Sarawak. It was established long before White Rajah James Brooke set foot in the state. The Chinese gold miners who settled at Siniawan were originally from Sambas, Mandor, or Montrado, which is called Indonesian West Kalimantan today. Their movements at that time were motivated by the gold rush and conflicts between rival groups of miners. The town later saw further upheavals. It went through the Japanese occupation, the Malaysia-Indonesia Confrontation, and the communist insurgency. Despite surviving through the bleakest of times, the town appears not as resilient as we think.







It is slowly losing its glitter. In the mid-19th century wooden architecture of the shophouses is unique and has attracted shutterbugs from near and far. Due to the town's rich historical legacy, the state Tourism and Heritage Ministry wants to turn Siniawan into a heritage town. Assistant minister Datuk Talip Zulpilip said the unique town design and its history should be preserved for the new generation. If Siniawan is gazetted as a heritage town, it would definitely become a major tourist attraction as it is one of the few places in Sarawak which has maintained its old building structure and architecture until today. Today Siniawan is not only a historical town but also a quaint village with a thriving bird's nests business. The locals have also started a regular weekend karaoke session. The two main rows of wooden shophouses have been modified into hawker food stalls during weekend evenings where tables and chairs are set right in the middle of the road.




